

Thanks to all who turned up at the last Working Bee on Saturday 11th August which unfortunately turned out to be one of the coldest wet days. Whilst the jobs that were planned had to be postponed Plan B was initiated with the result that all areas of the Club got a really good tidy/clean up which made life a lot easier for the Be In It competition 2 weeks later.

On the subject of the **Be In It Competition** it was pleasing that the number of members and the volume of items submitted for judging was greater compared to the past 5 years. Congratulations to all members who supported this competition which made the Judges' work selecting winners that little bit harder as they commented that the quality of entries keeps on improving. A full listing of categories and the worthy winners is on Page 4 of this Newsletter. At relatively short notice it has been announced by Council that the Rowville Stringybark Festival which formerly has been held on both a Saturday and Sunday will be reduced this year to Sunday only between 10am and 4.00pm. In light of this unexpected announcement a great deal of discussion has been undertaken at Committee level and the following major decisions have had to been made to adjust to the new scenario.

- The Club will man the event selling Kidz Korner kits only on Sunday 21st October.
- The traditional raffle will now be downsized accordingly and will be restricted for tickets to be sold by members to their family and friends only. It should be particularly noted that 7 prizes will now be offered and that the raffle will be drawn in the Clubrooms on Wednesday 5th December at 8.00pm.
- Due to a number of yet to be resolved issues relative to accessing the site the Club will be closed on Saturday 20th October to facilitate members own transport arrangements to take Club gear to the site which unfortunately will mean that the Club will not be open for 2 consecutive Saturdays as the 13th October has been allotted as our next Working Bee.

Invoices for annual Membership Fees along with Raffle tickets are normally available late August/early September, however, their

availability this year may be a little delayed awaiting the printing of the new Raffle Books (as detailed above), but, should still be available in the 1st week of September at the Clubrooms. Your cooperation in picking them up is appreciated which will reduce postage costs and don't forget that if you wish to vote at the AGM on Wednesday 3rd October you must be financial by that date.

SAFETY Corner

"Woodies" **SAFETY CORNER**


"Safety is no accident!"




Building on this month's feature article, I thought I would offer a few thoughts on some of the unique workshop safety issues encountered by Wood Turners. I am not a practicing Wood Turner myself so I confess to asking Club experts for help, while Mr Google may have also played his part.

In General Woodworking, a workpiece is restrained in some way and guided into contact with a high speed rotating cutter. In Wood Turning the reverse is the case. It is the workpiece that rotates at speed in a lathe and a cutting tool is manually held against the rotating workpiece by an operator. This reversal of roles introduces new risks for the operator.

Firstly, all the major operator risks found in General Woodworking are also found in Wood Turning. These are planning and preparing, good housekeeping, concentration, appropriate clothing and of course, dust extraction and PPE - Personal Protection Equipment.





Efficient dust collection is made more difficult around a lathe, because of limited access plus the amount of waste being removed. Dust collecting points can be mounted (as shown) or a dust hood on a telescopic arm are the most efficient collectors at the source of the dust.

PPE (Personal Protection Equipment) - An operator's sight, hearing, lungs and hands are the senses at most risk during Wood Turning. Sometimes an irregular workpiece is chosen for its attractive features, one made up of laminated pieces or simply one with a square or rectangular profile. These choices can be the cause of larger pieces breaking away and being thrown back at an operator. Operators (and spectators) should stand away from the "red zones". These zones are directly in front of (and behind) the workpiece. Ideally, it is recommended that operators wear a full face shield and one that covers the scalp. It is also best an irregular workpiece is trimmed of waste before mounting in the lathe and tool rest clearance should always be checked before beginning work. Turning should be paused often to check for faults as they might become visible in the surface.

When sanding a workpiece still mounted in the lathe, the tool rest should be removed for better access. It might also be tempting to use an application cloth to apply a finish product, but the risk of a cloth being caught makes this dangerous practice.

Spotlight on WOODTURNING Group (Monday morning)

This month. We're looking back into how/when the roots of the WOODWORKING Group came about, and how the many years of professional guidance by so many talented members have seen this aspect of woodworking flourish in the Club. In 2018, 30 years after the club was founded, this group meets on Monday mornings, under the guidance of Henk Eyssens. Henk follows many talented members making this a successful group, from the start, with: Alf Stephens, David Howell, Ivor Davies, Bruce Allen during the 1990's. Bob Plant spirited the club into having regular days set aside, and this is when the Group got its identity as a regular activity in 2001, together with John Emptage, Frank O'Connor and John Hooke. Joyce Brown and Jan Brown were regular contributors to this group, in the mid 1990's and early 2000's leading up to Henk Eyssens steering the ship with John Emptage from 2008-2011 and then Henk to the present day.

Before sharing the research into all this with members, it is with some anticipation, that **there will be more to the history** about this, and those many hard working members who were part of this over the decades. So, as this **'draft'** is shared, the intention is to edit it further and upload a refreshed edition to the Cloud for posterity. The lathe was donated by **Kevin Guilders** in 2012 and sits proudly in the Club's library.




Spotlight on WOODTURNING Group (Monday morning)

History of WOODTURNING at KDWC

The GROUP today, is as active and enthusiastic as it was from day one, back in **October 1988** when the club was formed by our **late founder: Alf Stephens.** But **today in 2018**, almost 30 years on, the Club boasts a significant number of lathes in its own purpose built room. Reaching this level, was no mean feat, and the acquisition of equipment was facilitated by many a generous provider, or funded by donations.

May 1989 - \$2000 donation gets first GOLDING lathes.



June 1989 saw Woodturning Classes being provided to the Club from **Bob Morrison**, member of Dandenong Woodworkers, Assoc and the Victorian Woodworkers Assoc

April 1990 Alf Stephens took 2 lathes to Knox Festival to turn up some timber into Veranda posts.

May 1990, Dandenong Woodworkers invited the FTG Club to see Gordon Griffith demo turning lamp bases. Our own club member, Tony Neve demonstrated the turning of lace bobbins

June 1990 saw late President **David Howell** along with **Peter Lorimer**, performing woodturning demos at Tecoma Primary School and **Hamish Hill** was offering fellow members to obtain offcuts for their woodturning, avoiding being more firewood!

Nov 1990 – **Ivor Davies** takes on the newsletter Editor role for 2 years from **John Fearn** and also gets stuck into helping the club get equipped with Nova Scroll chucks and useful accessories for the woodturners, his passion.

March 1991, the Editor [Gaz] enjoys recalling meeting Serge Meilak at the KNOX Festival seeing a lathe in action.... that novelty of seeing shavings flying off the chisel was enough to get excited about and become a member – typical of many members who came to learn of the club at such festivals.

Mar 1991 - David Jamie Knox Festival (Dick Kors background)



April 1991 saw a unique demo of a Symtec flatbed lathe.....

Sept 1991 a guest speaker: **Keith Little**, a well known woodturner from Montmorency, founder of Yarra Woodturners, demonstrated spindle-turning.

Nov 1991 announced **Bob Morrison** would demo the turning of a lidded box in December meeting.

Dec 1991 saw the first **Bill Gillingham** Award presented to member: **Keith Griffin**, in part for his "inside-out" turning.

April 1992 mentioned the March meeting had a display of a minilathe from member, and then secretary: Alex Davis. And typical of previous years at festival,s mention of Sue Wood capturing the imagination of festival goers with her woodturning skills. That year Yarra Turners and Forest Hill Woodturners organised a National Woodturning Competition/Exhibition/Sale at Nunawading Civic Centre 31/5/92

Oct 1992 Ingrained mentioned that the club now had 3 wood lathes in the workshop.

Dec 1993 Ingrained had a safety article pertinent to woodturning by former member, **Ray Easthope.**

Ivor Davies was a fine woodturner in the club, and had his own filming/training studio at home. (and also ran this newsletter). Ivor would be always active at demonstrations for the Club, and the two festivals each year.

Spotlight on WOODTURNING Group (Monday morning)

Mar 1994 Ingrained published an interesting set of statistics about members main woodworking interests, and Woodturning was ranked highest at 86%.

May 1994 documented the Knox Festival Woodturning competition, with **Vic Oberg** (member) and **Tom Coglan** (early Newsletter editor) equal first, and a special mention of our late **David Howell** (former president).


Nov 1994 Bruce Allen was doing woodturning demonstrations at Mitre10 Studpark.

April 1995, the club enjoyed a woodturning evening with Vic Wood in Burwood.

July 1995: A woodturning demo by **Wally Rowan** of Caton Woodturning. (16 members attending)

Dec 1995 - yes, there are lathes in the early main shed. (on right)

May 1997 saw the reporting of the purchase of a small woodturning lathe for the club. (A Record lathe at cost of \$700)

Aug 1997 - another woodturning demo, this one organised by **Bruce Allen** to have **Sue Patten** demonstrate miniatures.

Sep 2000 Woodturning demo by Doug Camps - turning a toy.






